


# Sailing update.



Our Club boats: - Steve Vandersteen is looked being able to allocate our club boats to individuals or families to be able to use a boat during the Covid 19 crisis. This would allow exclusive use of an adopted club boat by said person or persons. Updates to follow

Jon Close is looking into management of the Safety boats, when we do resume organised racing.

Steve Vandersteen will be completing another video within which he will be encouraging the use of a mast head float, to help prevent your mast getting stuck in the mud, during a capsize.



# Update on site maintenance.

Thanks to James and Andy Cush and all those who have attended the working parties.

Jetty work is going well. 8 manhours would see them operational.

James is having difficulty sourcing coach screws from Screwfix.

If we had sufficient enthusiasm 12 more manhours could go in on replacing some rotten runners on the Enterprise jetty, but they would be OK if left undone until autumn.

Rosemarie Benson, is working on the club boats. She has started cleaning them and is looking for volunteers to do more with her at Friday's June 12<sup>th</sup>, 10.00am work party. If you could assist with helping out Rosemarie, with some general cleaning and jet washing, that would be great.

Other items for the working party.

- Read Electricity Meter.
- Cut grass.
- Cut banks.
- Review cleaning protocol.
- Disinfect shower heads.

The next working party is Friday June 12<sup>th</sup> between 10:00 and 14:00. If you want to be involved please contact James Blackford. This will include cleaning the Club Boats with Rosemarie Benson.

Tool sharing protocol: - we need to wipe down tools with disinfectant. Please be vigilant on hygiene and sanitation. Please bring your own tools if you can, and bring your own food and refreshments.
